

annual contribution limit health care flexible spending account

effective january 1, 2026

Update to the summary plan descriptions (SPD) Changes described in this SMM are effective January 1, 2026.

The enclosed information serves as an official summary of material modification (SMM) for the **Health Care Flexible Spending Account (Health FSA)**. maximum annual contribution limit

This change applies to the Health Care Flexible Spending Account (Health FSA).

Effective **January 1**, **2026** the maximum amount you're allowed to contribute to the Chevron Health FSA is increasing:

- You can contribute up to \$3,300 (increase from \$3,200).*
- The minimum contribution remains \$120.

* The IRS limits the amount employees can contribute to a flexible spending account, and the limit may change from year-to-year. You cannot contribute more than the IRS annual limit each year. However, employers, like Chevron, are permitted to set an annual limit for their plans that may be *less than* the IRS annual limit. Should the IRS announce an increase to the maximum limit for 2026, Chevron is unable to change the Health FSA 2026 maximum contribution limit to align with the new IRS limit. This is due to the timing of Chevron's open enrollment administrative activities.
